Project Description:

Seymour became involved with the Heugh Battery (scheduled monument) in 2006 when we carried out emergency works to secure the walls and fabric of the building .

In 2007 following an unsuccessful bid under the BBC Restoration Programme which raised the profile of the Battery they were successful with a lottery bid which was matched by the council

The work was carried out in accordance with standard guidelines such as the IFA Standard and Guidance for Archaeology Watching Briefs. The first phase of the restoration works involved restoring the parade ground and creating the visitor centre in the old barrack rooms.

The visitors centre was a new build and involved the installation of all services and fit out. The existing building was refurbished. The works required sourcing of replacement materials such as tiles, bricks and finials etc. which meant Seymour Civil Engineering developed a network of architectural salvagers and manufacturers of reproduction materials.

We worked closely with the clients architects to overcome issues which arose as we exposed hidden problems. The works carried out included:
