Project Description:

The Headland in Hartlepool is a designated English Heritage Site and Seymour Civil Engineering has completed a negotiated contract under a partnering arrangement to carry out extensive hard landscaping and regeneration work to this historic area of the town using traditional materials.

Works included;

The careful hand demolition of an existing stone parapet wall and pillars. Construction of a new parapet wall to accommodate a plaque which was salvaged from the eastern most pillar of the parapet wall and restored. Installation of 200m Iron handrailing in keeping with the existing Victorian Style handrails and associated stanchions which are unique to Hartlepool. Sourced from a local contractor identified by the client.

The repair, refurbishment and repainting of existing Victorian iron railings and stanchions

The existing parapet wall was demolished by hand from the footpath, ensuring that debris did not fall to the promenade below.

This project was located in a public space close to residents properties which meant considerable care and liaison with those affected to ensure of their safety, health and wellbeing.

We provided a dedicated Customer Service Manager to Liaise with the public and residents to act as a visible point of contact.

We erected suitable barricades and hoardings which were well signposted and provided site specific information and contact details.

Road closures were notified well in advance and residents informed.

Vehicle movements were managed by a banksman to ensure safety of the public and properties.
